Serving God's people through food distributioon

One of our resources for becoming more intentional about engaging in ministry around the church comes through Western Seminary. It is called "Churches in Mission."

In March, we joined a cohort with 10 other churches from around the country that are all discerning how their resources and passions as a church address the needs and circumstances of the people around them.

Our Churches in Mission Team is comprised of Holly Schut, Kathy TenBrink, Paul Towne, Jen Werley, Garry Visscher, and me. We meet monthly by Zoom with our coach from the seminary, Hannah Stevens.

Early on in this process we are doing some interviewing of people in the church and in the neighborhood. Our hope is to get a clear picture of how we see ourselves as a church and how people around us see the neighborhood in which they live. This is an exercise in listening and bringing together stories and hope.

Each team member will be doing five interviews inside the church and five outside, so many of you will have an opportunity to be interviewed.

We have some ideas of people outside the church to talk with but need some suggestions as well. If you know someone who lives near the church to whom you would be willing to introduce one of our team members for a conversation, please let one of us know.

OUR FAITH-LED DECISIONS

Supervising Consistory & Shepherding Elders, Leadership Notes ... from April 2023

- ☐ The Supervising Consistory committed to revising their meeting agendas to spend the first hour of each meeting making plans for doing ministry in the church neighborhood. They will share stories from their conversations and connections as well as consider the impact of other decisions being made by the Supervising Consistory and Ministry Teams.
- □ Supervising Consistory received the responses to the nominations of Supervising Elders & Deacons and decided to extend additional opportunities to serve in those roles. The recent nominees will respond by the end of April.
- □ The Annual Spring Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, May 21, 2023, at 11:15am. The meeting will be held in the Gathering Place following worship. The agenda will include selecting Elders and Deacons as well as an update on church finances and on our mission to connect more deeply in the church neighborhood.
- □ Supervising Consistory noted that mission giving fell below expenses during March. Expenses from the "Mission & Ministry" section of the budget in the amount of \$2,525 were paid from the VanPutten Fund.
- ☐ Approved three grants from the Vision for Mission fund that were recommended by the Outreach & Mission Team: \$500 for Garry Visscher going to Mescalero, \$4,550 for Student Ministry going to Nashville, and \$615 for David Beattie going to Pine Ridge.
- ☐ The Shepherding Elders received the responses to the nominations of Shepherding Elders. They approved the names of those giving affirmative responses to be on the ballot for the congregational meeting.
- ☐ The Shepherding Elders reviewed their clusters to share health concerns and other needs.
- Our next celebration of the **Lord's Supper** will be on Pentecost Sunday, May 28, 2023. Communion will also be served to our Homebound Members at that time.



Feeding the Children of Haiti and More! Pastor Antoine Tends his Flock...

As Over 400 students at Emmah, Pastor Antoine's school are fed daily!

180 students are receiving their scholarships and are back to school

for Nursing, mechanics, teacher education, accounting and so much more! Twenty children and young adults are living in the "Family" at Mission Love Haiti! Forty staff and teachers are being paid a salary and are able to feed their families!

All of this during a year when life has been very tenuous and chaos is still a part of many Haitian lives. Beautiful Response can only accomplish this when our generous support base continues to be faithful. Galations 6:9 encourages us, "Do not grow weary in doing good, for in the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." We often need to hang on to this word. When we think of the needs of our dear friends in Haiti we know that giving up is not an option.


Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God...
